

 Points to note

Please read the “Electronic Resources User Guidelines” thoroughly if you are using electronic resources for the first time. Moreover, please ensure that you adhere to copyright law and the various regulations and conditions set by the provider. Inappropriate use of electronic resources will not only see the individual in question have their user rights discontinued, but the entire University will be suspended from using that service. Legal procedures may also result, leading to significant impact on the University’s learning, education and research activities.

The following is not permitted:

- (1) Use other than for the individual’s learning, education or research.
- (2) Bulk or continuous large volume data downloads due to automated programs.
- (3) Manually instigated large volume data downloads that exceed the permitted scope of the individual’s use.
- (4) Systematic or comprehensive downloads of specific electronic resources.
- (5) Modification, redistribution, re-sale or unauthorized reproduction of downloaded data.
- (6) Making search results public without the authorization of the copyright holder.
- (7) Other acts that violate copyright law or user regulations etc.

\* Use must match the User Regulations, Terms and Conditions or Terms of Use indicated on the websites of each provider.

In addition, it is possible to use electronic resources within the University when a contract has been entered into with the provider. If user access is stopped due to what is judged to be inappropriate behavior, regardless of whether malicious intent is involved or simple carelessness, significant negative impact would be experienced by the University and its people. We have summarized the types of inappropriate behavior that users tend to commit in the file entitled “[Inappropriate Use of Electronic Resources](#)”, so please ensure that you read this.
