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Academic Calendar

The academic year at Stockholm University is divided into two semesters:

- Autumn Semester: 1 September 2025 18 January, 2026.
- Spring semester: 19 January 7 June 2026.

Examinations are arranged throughout the year with no fixed examination periods. For a complete academic calendar, visit <u>su.se/termdates</u>

Language Requirements

Exchange through University-Wide Agreements

Exchange students whose first language is not English must show English proficiency through one of the following:

- o English Certificate Letter from home university equal to below.
- o IELTS: 6.0 overall with at least 5.5 in each of the four components.
- o TOEFL: PBT 550 or iBT 79. Please note that we do not accept TOEFL iBT MyBest.

Test results should not be more than two years old.

Exchange through Nordlys, CIVIS, and north2north programs

No English certificate needed unless specifically requested.

Nominations

Partner universities must submit nominations via our portal by:

- Spring semester: 20 September
- Autumn semester: 1 April Instructions are provided in advance.

Nomination, Application & Admission

Application & Course Selection

Nominated students will receive application instructions from SU's International Office and must read the *Fact Sheet* and *Guide for Application, and Course Selection* before applying. Application deadlines:

Spring semester: 1 OctoberAutumn semester: 15 April

Admission

Admitted students receive a Letter of Acceptance and a welcome letter. Course admission is confirmed by departments at latest by August (for autumn) or December (for spring).

If a course is declined, students will be contacted to choose alternatives.

Note: Admission to the exchange program does not guarantee course enrollment. In

each course syllabus eligibility criteria are

found.

Housing

Admitted exchange students receive housing application instructions by email after Letter of Acceptance is sent out, and must apply by the deadline to receive housing offer. Visa Information

Course Registration and Learning Agreement

The departments register exchange students for courses and provide final course information prior to the start of each course. Learning Agreements can only be signed after final confirmation of course admissions by each relevant department and signed by the <u>departmental coordinator</u> at the department where the student takes most or all of their courses.

Insurance

All incoming exchange students at Stockholm University are automatically covered, free of charge, by <u>Kammarkollegiet's Student IN insurance</u>, while registered for courses as exchange students. Exchange students that needs to visit a doctor must pay for the appointment upfront and then submit a claim for reimbursement. Please note that this insurance does not cover home insurance and must be arranged, separatly by the exchange students.

Departure from Stockholm University

Before departure, exchange students will receive essential information about their departure and be invited to a farewell event. Once grades are finalized, exchange students are provided with digital transcripts containing a verification link and can download their official transcript of records. Course restrictions	o Students should not select online courses or courses from more than two
	departments.
	o Students should not take courses at the Department of Law except for students
	nominated through the CIVIS network (more details are provided in the box below).
Information for CIVIS students	o Exchange students coming through CIVIS networks must select at least 75% (22,5
	credits/hp) of their classes within the field of study that they are nominated for. If
	possible, students will be permitted to select 25% of their classes at another
	department.
	o CIVIS students can apply for courses at the Department of Law but are not
	guaranteed admission due to limited seats available.
	o Law students need to have studied at least 120 Law credits before starting their
	studies at Stockholm University, 120 credits are equivalent to two years of full-time
	studies.
